Ask Betsy!

Q: I've been taking Zoom classes, watching YouTube and other online videos but I don't know how to determine if my skills are improving or if I'm just making "stuff". How do I know if I'm making progress?

A: It's been a difficult year for everyone, and, while things are calming down, it will most likely still be a little while before we're back to some semblance of normal (whatever that is). For most of us, our work is made to be shown, whether it's for sale, exhibition, or just simply wearing it. It's hard to get feedback when you're not out there with other people face to face. But there are ways to gauge your progress, even virtually.

Whether we're beginners or more accomplished artists, we can be hard on ourselves. Ask yourself if some processes have become easier. Do you have to think less about how to set up a soldering procedure? Are your stampings/rivets/bails/whatever more consistent? Sometimes things become second nature to us without us even noticing. Take some time to look at your workmanship which is, to be honest, the important part. Look at your seams, look at your edges, look at your surfaces. Are there less file marks to clean up than

before? Are your stampings and textures more uniform? Sometimes we take things for granted which we should actually consider signs of progress.

MASSC has some events that can help you assess and improve your skills too. There are monthly design challenges and periodic Show & Tell events. These are not competitive events, so you don't have to worry about being judged. If you're not comfortable enough to enter them, then at least attend them. Entrants talk about their work and you can learn a lot from hearing how they realized their finished pieces. You will see that even more advanced artists come up against challenges, but, even better, you may find that you really do have many of the skills they used in their creations and it might give you some confidence to take part and open yourself up to some positive feedback that can give you a real boost. So keep watching the newsletter and website for announcements of these events.


